





Message from Park Vista's Executive Director

This semester is a joyous one, as we break ground on the Gelhaar Center, the new home of the Mahoning Valley Lifelong Learning Institute. Our journey began in 2009. We started by listening to the voice of our residents, and to their experiences in lifelong learning at the Chautauqua Institution in New York, at university-based cultural events around the country, and through attending Elderhostel, which is now known as the Road Scholar Network. These experiences were the baseline for our Institute.

The Institute grew over the next six years as we:

- Formed the advisory board, with Carlton Sears, Nick Mager, Ginny Pasha and Tiffany Hughes providing their expertise.
- Established partnerships with the Mahoning Valley Historical Society, the Public Library of Youngstown & Mahoning County, and Youngstown State University, adding depth and local expertise to our lectures.
- Launched www.MVLLI.org to provide information about the Institute and its lectures, as well as a method to directly donate to it.
- Hired Marise Sahyoun as director to bring fresh direction to the Institute's growth.
- Were accepted as part of the Road Scholar Network, placing the MVLLI in a national database with 400 other institutes and providing resources for expansion.

While the Institute's growth involved much planning and leadership, it would not have been possible without our donors. Because of their generosity we successfully completed a \$1 million campaign for capital improvements and program endowment. Donor funding is making possible a technologically advanced learning center equipped to aid those with vision and hearing impairments, as well as provide access to virtual learning,



bringing lectures from around the world to our campus. Attached to it will be an atrium and a courtyard featuring a one-of-a-kind sculpture garden, providing unique spaces for respite and reflection. The campaign also set out to endow the Institute's four lecture series: The Harris Lecture Series on History and Political Science; The Gelhaar Lecture Series on Arts and Culture; The Kyle Lecture Series on Religion and Spirituality; and the Wellness and Rehabilitation Lecture Series. Over \$400,000 was raised to ensure future growth of each series, keep lectures affordable and allow for continued improvement of the Institute's offerings.

Since 1947, Park Vista has been the leader in providing services to the Mahoning Valley's older adults through our independent and assisted living, skilled nursing, memory care center, short-term rehab center, aquatic and outpatient therapy, and now the Mahoning Valley Lifelong Learning Institute. Our donors have been with us every step of the way, making it possible for us to innovate and grow our mission to better serve you.

While this fall will be an exciting time for us, we also ask for your patience as this semester will bring changes in venue as we ready the Gelhaar Center for exciting adventures in learning.

I look forward to standing with you in 2016 for the dedication of the Gelhaar Center. Enjoy this semester.
